



Why we need this...

Cape Henlopen School District enrollment has grown from 4,150 students in 2001 to 5,169 students in September 2015. This is an increase of 1,019 students since 2001. Population studies show our enrollment will continue to increase significantly over the next 20 years. The proposed replacement and renovated elementary schools will give us the additional capacity we need to keep up with enrollment growth. The State of Delaware has recognized the need for these building projects and has agreed to contribute \$106,111,300 if we are able to pass a local referendum to raise the other \$48,410,100. The average age of the current four elementary schools and the Lewes building is 70 years old.





Q: What is included in the referendum proposal?

A: A new 720 student elementary school for H. O. Brittingham Elementary, a new 720 student elementary school for Rehoboth Elementary School, a renovated and new addition 720 student elementary school for Milton Elementary School, a renovated and new addition 720 student elementary school for Shields Elementary School to be located in the Lewes School building.

Q: How much will the major capital improvements cost?

A: The total of all projects (including the 100% State Funded Sussex Consortium land and building) will cost \$154,521,400. The State of Delaware will contribute \$106,111,300. The local portion funded through referendum would be \$48,410,100.

Q: How does this building proposal fit into the District's long-range facility plan?

A: The proposal to replace and renovate our elementary schools addresses Phase III of the District's 20-year, long-range facilities plan adopted in 1999. Phase I was completed in 2004 with the construction of two new middle schools. Phase II was completed in 2009 with the construction of the new Cape Henlopen High School. Phase III calls for addressing the elementary schools. A new elementary school is currently under construction and was the first step in accomplishing the Phase III elementary school plan.

Q: How will these projects improve student safety?

A: Students will be in modernized buildings equipped with the latest safety enhancements and design. The current elementary schools that are being replaced/renovated are currently 50 to 95 years in age.

Q: Is there an operational expense included in the proposal?

A: There is no operational expense included in this proposal. The only tax increase proposed with this referendum is for a debt service tax increase for construction and renovation expenses.

Q: Where will the renovated and remodeled elementary schools be located?

A: Cape Henlopen School District is very fortunate that all four elementary schools have enough space available on their current sites to accommodate the new and renovated buildings. All four schools will be located on their current site, on land the district already owns (Shields Elementary will be across the street on the Lewes School property).
